

# Community Engagement Council 2011-2012 Project Selection Meeting

April 28th, 2011

# Background

- From January April, 2011, members of CPN staff and the Community Engagement Council met with key leaders throughout the Neighborhood to talk about issues and priorities.
- The shared concerns were in very general areas such as reducing crime, keeping a strong sense of community, and maintaining safe community centers and common areas.
- After reviewing the priorities on April 14<sup>th</sup>, the CEC decided to hold a facilitated planning meeting and to invite other members of the community to join them to help craft a strategy that would benefit the entire community.

- CEC member Marvetta Daniels arranged for the use of the St. Julian Divine Center, located in the Eastside part of the CPN near Sanders-Clyde Elementary.
- Laura Deaton, the Managing Director for CPN, facilitated the meeting, which was held from 6:30-8:30 pm. Light snacks and beverages were provided. Dwayne Green (CPN CEO) and Amanda Coté (CPN Ops Manager), were also present to support the process.

#### The Process

- Aj Davis welcomed participants, and led introductions.
- Laura shared the ground rules, gave a little background about CPN, and then talked about the structure of the planning.

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## Mix, Divide, and Mix Again

- The group was divided into two smaller groups. Each group was given a set of note cards with the same set of potential projects on them.
- The groups were asked to add their own ideas, and then sort the ideas in order with the top choices on the top of the stack.
- The groups were told that they would do this three different times, reporting out between each topic, and then moving so that the groups mingled differently each time.

# The Topics

- (1) CREATING AWARENESS: What are some great ways that we could create awareness about Neighborhood needs and strengths/assets?
- (2) STRENGTHENING CONNECTIONS: What are some great ways that we could strengthen connections across the Neighborhood?
- (3) ADVOCACY: What are some ways we could empower people to advocate for themselves and for the Neighborhood as a whole?

# The Voting

- The top three ideas from each group from each round were put on white paper around the room.
- Each participant was given 18 stickers to vote with. They could spread them out or put them all on just one favorite...however they wished.
- The top three vote-winners overall were chosen.

## And The Winners Are...

- (1) Foster and cultivation next-generation leadership and activism through the development and support of a <u>CPN Youth Leadership Council</u> composed of middle and high school students from the Neighborhood.
- (2) Empower and engage existing community members by designing and hosting a CPN Neighborhood Leadership Training series.
- (3) Provide regular informational updates on Neighborhood-related events, issues and alerts via a telephone-based automated messaging system, with call-out capabilities.

### Next Steps

- After voting, the group then came back together to do a quick near-term assessment of what would be needed in the next 3 months to get started with these projects.
- The group agreed to form sub-committees to develop a detailed timeline and assign responsibilities.
- CPN will work with the Community Engagement Council leadership to create a schedule and a process for assessing interest in sub-committees.


